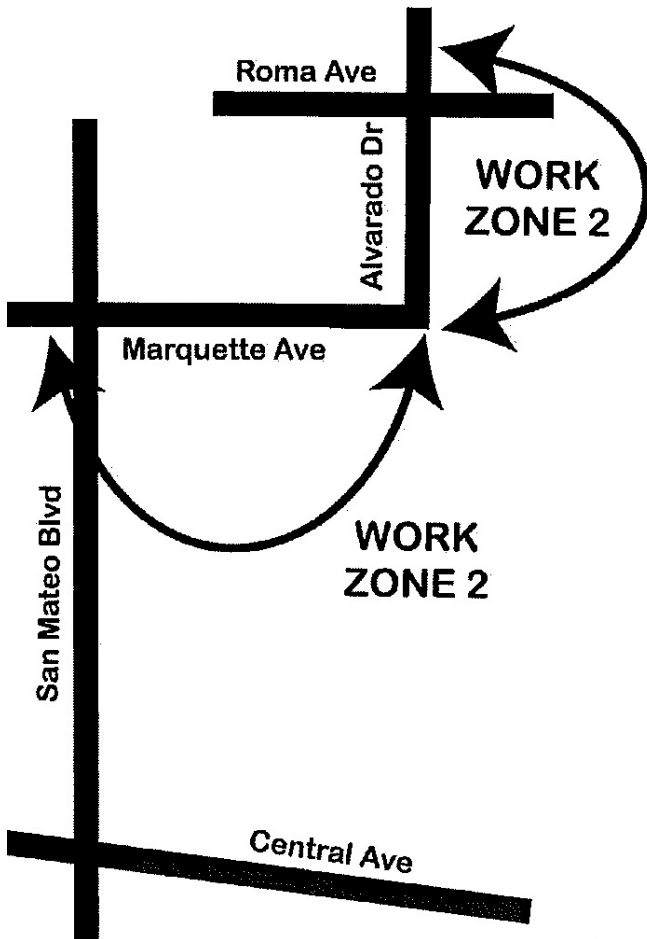


SAN JUAN-CHAMA DRINKING WATER PROJECT
BURTON PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION
ALVARADO FROM ROMA TO MARQUETTE &
WEST ON MARQUETTE TO SAN MATEO
Securing Our Future Water Supply

NOTE: All work is scheduled weather permitting and is subject to change without notice.

Starting the week of **October 22nd**, a tunneling construction crew will be moving to the intersection of **San Juan** and **Alvarado, to tunnel under San Juan**. The intersection will be **completely closed** during tunneling operations. Crews will also begin installing temporary water services to homes on **Alvarado** between **Roma and Marquette**. Work hours will be from **7 a.m. – 7 p.m. Monday – Friday and 8 a.m. – 6 p.m. on Saturdays**, although crews may occasionally work longer hours if needed. Motorists on Alvarado are encouraged to use Palomas as an alternative route.



From the week of **November 12** through December, a pipeline crew will start installing a large 42" diameter pipeline on **Alvarado** from **Roma to Marquette** and will work **west on Marquette to San Mateo**. While the crews are working, the road is expected to be **totally closed in 3-block segments** during this operation. **ACCESS WILL BE MAINTAINED TO RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES**, however, you should expect delays. Motorists on Marquette are encouraged to use San Juan as an alternative route.

Following the 42" diameter pipeline installation, crews will be installing a new 6" waterline on **Alvarado** from **Roma to Marquette** and on **Marquette** from **Alvarado to San Mateo**. Flagmen will be on-site to assist with directing traffic during the 6" waterline installation as necessary. Motorists should expect delays. If water shut-offs are necessary while crews are working on your block, homeowners will be notified in advance. **Paving for this work zone is expected to be completed by late December (weather permitting).**

NOTE: Different crews will be working on different types of activities throughout the project (*underground bores at major intersections to avoid disrupting heavy traffic, installing large pipeline, installing small water distribution lines as well as water meters and fire hydrants*) therefore; work may not be done in a linear fashion.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: CREWS MAY ASK TO VIDEOTAPE YOUR PROPERTY - A representative from ERS, the contractor, may contact you prior to the time construction crews are scheduled to be in a "work zone" that includes your property to request permission to videotape exterior and interior structures. This is optional. Contact Pete Dobbs (see numbers below) for more information. Videotaping permission forms will be hand delivered by an ERS employee and videotaping can be scheduled with the homeowner.
