

**SAN JUAN-CHAMA DRINKING WATER PROJECT**  
**BURTON PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION**  
**TO START ON HERMOSA WEEK OF OCT. 29, 2007**

***Securing Our Future Water Supply***

***NOTE: All work is scheduled weather permitting and is subject to change without notice.***

Over the next few weeks, a small crew will be installing temporary water lines to homes on **Hermosa Drive** between **Marquette Avenue** and **Copper Avenue**. Currently the mainline crew is installing 42" diameter pipe on Marquette. They are expected to turn onto **Hermosa** late in the week of **October 29<sup>th</sup>**. The crew will install 42" diameter pipe on Hermosa approximately to **Grand**. Then crews will move off Hermosa the **week of November 14<sup>th</sup>** to install large diameter pipeline on **Alvarado Drive**. The mainline crew will return to **Hermosa** to finish installation of the 42" diameter pipe to **Copper** in **early to mid December**.

After the 42" diameter pipeline is installed on **Hermosa Drive**, a new 6" water main will be installed and homes will be connected to the new 6" water main. Road paving will be completed after all pipeline installation has occurred on **Hermosa** to **Copper**, which is scheduled in **early January**, weather permitting.

Starting in **early January 2008**, a crew will be installing a tunnel **under the intersection of Central Avenue at Hermosa** to install 42" diameter pipeline. This tunnel is scheduled to be completed in late January.

**Work hours will be from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. Monday – Friday and 8 a.m. – 6 p.m. on Saturdays**, although crews may occasionally work longer hours if needed. There will also be minimal work that must occur late at night to schedule water outages to connect the new 6" water main to the existing 6" water main. ***While crews are installing the large diameter pipeline and performing paving operations, the road is expected to be totally closed in 3-block segments.***

Motorists on Hermosa are encouraged to use Carlisle Boulevard as an alternative route. ***ACCESS WILL BE MAINTAINED TO RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES, however, you should expect delays. If water shut-offs are necessary while crews are working on your block, you will be notified in advance.***

**NOTE:** Different crews will be working on different types of activities throughout the project (*underground bores at major intersections to avoid disrupting heavy traffic, installing large diameter pipeline, installing small water distribution lines as well as water meters and fire hydrants*) therefore, work may not be done in a linear fashion.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE: CREWS MAY ASK TO VIDEOTAPE YOUR PROPERTY** - A representative from ERS, the contractor, may contact you prior to the time construction crews are scheduled to be in a "work zone" that includes your property to request permission to videotape exterior and interior structures. This is optional. Contact Pete Dobbs (see numbers below) for more information. Videotaping permission forms will be hand delivered by an ERS employee and videotaping can be scheduled with the homeowner.
