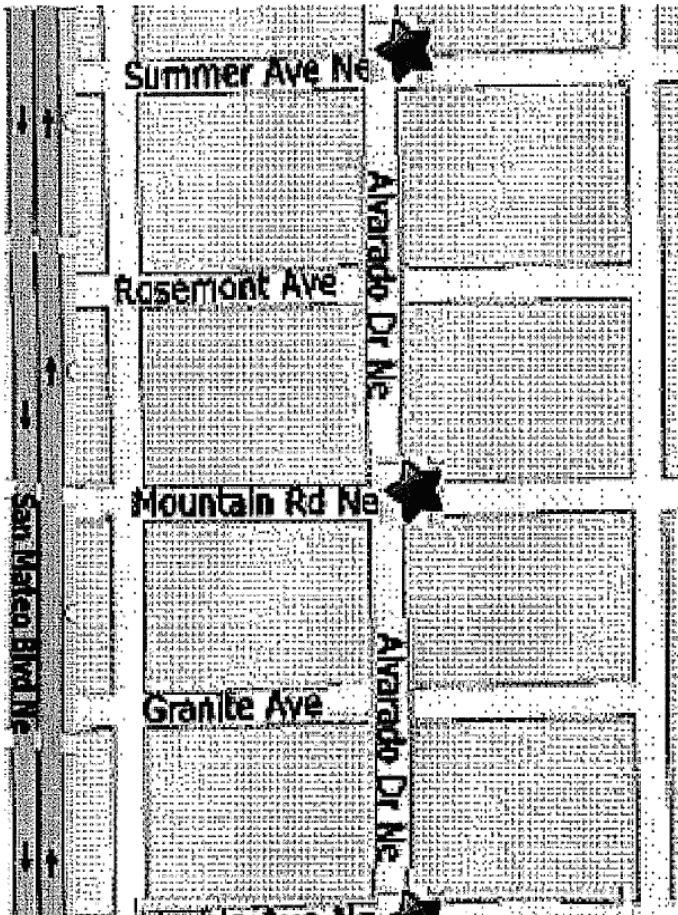


SAN JUAN-CHAMA DRINKING WATER PROJECT
CHARLES WELLS PIPELINE - PAVING UPDATE
ALVARADO BETWEEN SUMMER & MARBLE
Securing Our Future Water Supply

NOTE: All work is scheduled weather permitting and is subject to change without notice.



Starting **Wednesday, November 14**, the intersections of **Summer Avenue & Alvarado Drive**, **Mountain Road & Alvarado Avenue**, and **Marble Avenue & Alvarado Drive** will be completely **CLOSED** while crews re-pave these intersections. First, the current pavement in these intersections will be removed, then the roadway will be graded, and finally new pavement will be installed.

These three intersections are being re-paved in order to restore the intersections to the pre-existing water drainage patterns.

Paving crews will also be working to remove some low spots along the gutter pans on **Alvarado Drive** in several locations between **Constitution** and **Alice**.

The work is expected to be completed, with the roadways open to traffic, by **Wednesday, November 21** (weather permitting). Work hours for paving will be **7 a.m.-7 p.m.**

Motorists are encouraged to use **San Mateo Boulevard** or **San Pedro Drive** as alternate

routes. Local residents are encouraged to use **Rosemont Avenue** and **Granite Avenue** as alternate routes.

NOTE: When crews are paving, portions of the roadway may be blocked for 3-4 hours to allow the asphalt to harden. If you have special concerns or needs, please contact:

About the San Juan-Chama Drinking Water Project

The Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority's San Juan-Chama Drinking Water will supply up to 90% of the metropolitan area's future water. San Juan-Chama water diverted from the river will be transported to a state-of-the-art treatment plant, from which purified water will be delivered to Albuquerque area homes and businesses. The overall project is scheduled to be completed in 2008.
