Evaporation is when liquid water turns into a gas - the hotter it gets, the faster it evaporates! Water is in the air all around us, but it's so small we can't see it. Say it with me. **Evaporation.**

There's water all around us now (Flap our wings.) But it's too small to drink.

Let's fly up to that cloud (Point.)

Let's my up to that cloud (Forme.)

Look at all the droplets here. (Look around.)

Let's scoop them up with our hands. (Scoop.)

Gulp, gulp.

Yum, yum. (Rub tummy.)

We're getting bigger.

We're getting heavier.

Condensation.

Condensation is when little molecules or droplets join together to form bigger and bigger droplets. Say it with me. **Condensation**.

We're inside a big raindrop.

Uh-oh (Arms moving around.)

This raindrop's falling. (Sit down.)

Precipitation.

Precipitation is when water falls from the sky as rain, snow, hail, or sleet. Say it with me. **Precipitation.**

We're in the river, you better swim! (Front crawl.)

Back stroke. (Back stroke.)

Dog paddle. (Dog paddle.)

Uh-oh.

Washed ashore.

Now we're sitting in the mud.

Squish squish. (Hands in the mud.)

Uh-oh. (Moving arms around.)

Sinking.

Infiltration.

Infiltration is when water sinks into the ground. Say it with me. **Infiltration.**

It's really tight between these rocks! We must be in the aquifer.

The **aquifer** is a layer of dirt, sand, gravel, and rock where water fills all the spaces around them. Since the spaces are connected, the water can flow slowly through the aquifer. We can't see it because it is underground. Say it with me. **Aquifer.**

Hold your nose so you don't drown. (Say this

while holding your nose.)

Blub-blub. (Hand up above your head.)

Uh-oh.

We're getting pulled to that pipe. (Lean to the right with hands over your head.)

We're being pumped into that well!

We're in the bottom of the well!

Hello up there! (Look up and yell with hands

cupped around mouth.)

Can we get some help?

No help. (Shrug.)

We better start climbing

Up we go! (As if climbing a ladder.)

We made it! (Jump for joy.)

I'm thirsty again.

Are you thirsty again?

We're all thirsty again!

Do you want to go on a water hunt?

NO!

7. Water – It's Solid, Liquid, and Gas

(First teach students a motion to make when they hear "solid," another for "liquid," and a crazy one for "gas.")

(Now here's the last verse. It is a little sad. It might make you cry.)

It's okay. Remember the water cycle? The water cycle, yes, that's right. That water vapor can condense into clouds, and when those clouds let go of that liquid water it can freeze. And then that frozen water is snow, which is a solid. Then I can make another snowman! Let's sing another chorus.
