
## **Animals**



**Fish** are animals that are cold-blooded. They have a backbone

- Fish breathe with gills that take in oxygen from the water. The water carries away their carbon dioxide.
- Fish use fins to move.
- Fish live their lives in the water.

**Reptiles** like snakes, lizards, and turtles are animals that are cold-blooded. They have a backbone.

- A Reptiles have dry, scaly skin.
- Reptiles usually lay soft eggs on land.

**Amphibians** like frogs and toads are animals that are cold-blooded. They have a backbone.

- Amphibian larvae hatch from eggs. The larvae use gills to get air from water. In later stages, amphibians use lungs to breathe.
- Amphibians have soft, moist skin.
